# GRACE EPISCOPAL HOMELESS SHELTER

On Tuesday July 31, as we were recovering from Greek Fest, it was again the time for volunteers from Assumption to provide a meal, other food and kitchen supplies, and a crew of servers for homeless men at the shelter at Grace Episcopal Church and operated by Porchlight Inc. We were

advised that day by Karla Thennes, executive director of Porchlight, "Numbers at the shelter have been unusually high all summer. We averaged 85 all last week and had 89 last night."

Faithful volunteers came through as usual. A kitchen crew led by Ilektra Kolokouri prepared a hot meal of Greek-style chicken, rice, and green beans, which was really enjoyed by the home-less men at the shelter. There was enough food so that seconds were served and much appreciated.

The meal was transported to the shelter by Mike and Nancy Smith. Serving the dinner were Scott Spevacek, Peter Cameron, Christ Schmidt. I also helped and had previously gone shopping for the usual supplies such as 10 loaves of bread, 10 gallons of milk, bags of apples, de-caf coffee, fruit juice, dish sponges, cheese, peanut butter, etc. We have provided these supplies upon the recommendation of shelter organizers since the mid-1980s when we first began working at the drop-in shelter. The Philoptochos Society at Assumption generously funds the extra food supplies whenever we work at the shelter. It usually amounts to about \$115.

The next and final time in 2018 it will be our turn at the shelter is October 30. That will be the fourth time this year that volunteers from Assumption have worked to fill the needs of homeless people in Madison. Our turn comes up every month that has a 5th Tuesday. If you are interested in helping on October 30, please let me or Ilektra know. There is always a spot for you in this worthy effort.

Again our lessons will take place in our church once a week, after Divine Liturgy. We will again offer two language levels, the beginner/ intermediate and the intermediate/ more advanced level. If Sunday is not a good day for you, if you need some extra tutoring hours in learning Greek, or to make up lessons that you may have to miss throughout the year please do not hesitate to contact me so I can arrange a meeting for some private tutoring with a teacher who will work with our school this year, a native Greek language speaker and member of our church community, Eleni Patenaude who has been offering private Greek language tutoring for the last 30 years.

Returning students do not need to fill any enrollment form unless their information has changed. New students DO need to enroll by September 15. There is NO tuition for participating in the Greek school but only a registration fee for all returning and new students of \$50.00 per student that will be used to cover some school expenses.
